Counselor News:

I know it's hard to believe, but graduation is just around the corner. May 16th will be here before we know it!

There is still much to do this semester. If your child has not applied to a post-secondary school (college, technical college, trade school, etc), he/she is encouraged to do so now. If he/she plans to apply for financial aid, he/she must be accepted by the college or school before he/she will be considered for financial aid.

If your child is applying for financial aid and/or the TOPS scholarship, you will need to complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). The FAFSA is found online at www.fafsa.gov. Both you and your child must get a FAFSA ID to use as a signature for the FAFSA. You can get it at www.fafsa.gov and click on FAFSAID on the top of the page. Remember that completing the FAFSA is a state requirement for graduation.

Seniors and parents are encouraged to read the senior bulletin and google classroom. There are several local scholarships that will be available in the spring semester and will be advertised in the senior bulletin.

The St. Charles Parish School System is seeking Staff Achievement Award nominees. One staff member from eight categories will be selected for recognition at the Staff Achievement Awards ceremony in April. The deadline to submit a nomination is Monday, March 25, 2024. Nomination forms and categories are on the district website under Public Information.

Scholarships

It is never too early to start looking for scholarship opportunities! Juniors can visit their grade-level Google Classrooms to see listings and to determine eligibility. If eligible, students should go to the scholarship website to apply online or to the Counselors Suite for an application, as directed. Make sure that you meet all criteria before applying

Campus Visits

Juniors and seniors are given excused days to visit colleges; juniors can receive one excused day, and seniors can receive two.

To receive the excused day, students must make an appointment with the college's admissions office, then pick up a college visitation form from the Counselors Sutie and return it with a parent's signature three days in advance.

A parent must attend with the student (this will be verified) and an official from the college visited must also verify the trip.

Greetings Sophomores and Parents,

The spring semester is a great time to review your goals and get refocused. What do you want to accomplish this semester? I want to suggest taking good care of yourself, and begin by working on your sleep. More and more research suggests sleep is very important to your learning and health.

The Harvard Women's Health Watch suggests six reasons to get enough sleep:

- ~Learning and memory: Sleep helps the brain commit new information to memory through a process called memory consolidation. In studies, people who'd slept after learning a task did better on tests later.
- ~Metabolism and weight: Chronic sleep deprivation may cause weight gain by affecting the way our bodies process and store carbohydrates, and by altering levels of hormones that affect our appetite.
- ~Safety: Sleep debt contributes to a greater tendency to fall asleep during the daytime. These lapses may cause falls and mistakes such as medical errors, air traffic mishaps, and road accidents.
- ~Mood: Sleep loss may result in irritability, impatience, inability to concentrate, and moodiness. Too little sleep can also leave you too tired to do the things you like to do.
- ~Cardiovascular health: Serious sleep disorders have been linked to hypertension, increased stress hormone levels, and irregular heartbeat.
- ~Disease: Sleep deprivation alters immune function, including the activity of the body's killer cells. Keeping up with sleep may also help fight cancer.

On another note: Sophomores with World Geography and Business English will be sitting with their counselor to create their Individual Graduation Plan (IGP). You will be asked to review the plan, sign it, and return it to school. Keep up with your child's grades via PowerSchool. Remember: you are your child's most powerful influence. If you need your PowerSchool log in, drop by the office and pick it up.
