### Technology

ACM has two technology labs in order to further integrate technology into the curriculum. Our Technology Literacy Labs are designed to ensure students have the necessary skills to utilize the Microsoft Suite programs (Word, Excel, PowerPoint and Publisher). The labs are equipped with 24 multi-media work stations using Windows 7 software. There are also digital cameras, a flex camera, and an LCD projector in the labs. We have 45 notebooks and 35 laptops for students to utilize either in the lab or during classroom instruction. Our school also has 12 Promethean Boards, 6 Active Slates, and 24 iPod Touches. Every core content teacher has also received a classroom set of Google Chromebooks for students to use during classroom instruction. All of this equipment enables students to use technology to enhance their learning experiences.
