Important Reminders

- Please check your child's folder daily. If you have a note, please make sure the note is in front of all papers inside of the homework folder. Please take out any papers sent home daily.

Optional/ Extra Practice At Home

- Practice counting sets of objects 1-10 and writing numbers 0-10.
- Practice orally blending two and three sounds into words. For example: You say /c/ /a/ /t/ and your child says “cat.” Practice orally segmenting two and three sound words into sounds. For example: You say “cat” and your child should tell you the sounds in cat: /c//a//t/. Reach out to your child's teacher if you need additional guidance.
- Practice reading and writing two, three, four, and five sound words with the letter sounds we have already learned: m, a, t, d, o, c, g, i, n, h, s, f, v, z, p, e, b, l, r, u, w, j, y, x, and k.
- The word cards and tricky word readers sent home for homework can be kept at home and used for extra practice.

What are we learning?

This week we will begin Unit 8 and will learn new tricky words *funny*, *all*, and *from*. The students will read about a new character, Sam, and will be reading new stories in their readers.

In math, we will find 10 ones in a teen number and learn to write numbers 11-20. Students will also order numerals from 0-20 using a one more pattern. Students will reason about a number's position in the number sequence and count out a group of objects to match a numeral using their new learning of numbers 11-20.

Counselor's Corner

In the month of March, students will learn R in CARES which is Responsibility. Students will have lessons on how to be responsible both at home and school. Students will also learn about friendship. Students will continue to learn the importance of Digital Wellness and how to stay safe when they are online.
