English Language Arts

As we move into this week, we will continue our final unit in ELA for the year: "The Louisiana Purchase." Throughout this unit, we will explore the history of our state of Louisiana and the people involved. Our studies will help us to answer our Culminating Task question at the end of this unit: Who benefited the most and who benefited the least from the Louisiana Purchase and why? As we explore this unit, be prepared to review vocabulary with your child that is specific to the time and era. This unit will also help us hone our social studies skills, as we prepare to learn about Louisiana history through map skills, geography and interactions with different groups of people. There is no homework spiral this week, but students should read the same passage for fluency this week.

Social Studies/Flex Group Time

Flex Grouping has resumed! Based on the MOY (middle of the year) data, students have been painstakingly placed in learning environments best suited to their individual needs. Additionally, we will continue with our new Social Studies curriculum on alternate days. Students will continue learning about "The Founding of the United States of America".

Math

This week in math, we will begin Module 5: Fractions as Numbers by exploring lessons 1-6. Lessons 1-6 will cover partitioning a whole into equal parts and unit fractions and their relationship to the whole. We will also take a Topic A quiz on **Friday** which will cover lessons 1-5. Students should complete the page numbers listed below for homework each night and study their facts nightly.

Science

This week's science class will continue with **Module 3: Traits**. We will be completing lessons 14-16. Our primary focus will be on the question: "How do individuals get their traits?" Students will explore that offspring inherit traits from their parents. Students are encouraged to review the Learning Log every night to prepare for all upcoming assessments as part of their homework routine.
