English Language Arts

As we continue our Cajun Folktales unit, we will read two new stories about trickster rabbits, "The Tale of Peter Rabbit" and *Dear Peter Rabbit*. As we read each story, we will continue to determine what makes the rabbit a good animal to play a trickster, in addition to comparing and contrasting the various story elements found within each story, while also using **evidence** from the text. This week the purple fluency folder will come home again. Students will read the same passage as last week, "The Flying Tortoise." In addition, students will answer new questions about the same story. As a reminder, the homework questions help to prepare your child for assessments and the fluency folder is for you and your child to practice reading fluently three times a week together. At the end of each week, we will read and chart our progress in class in our journey of becoming better readers. If you have any questions on how to use the fluency folder, please do not hesitate to reach out.

Social Studies/Flex Group Time

This week, during our Flex Group Time, we will begin moving into various literacy groups. Students have now been assigned to teachers based on specific skills needed. Each teacher will provide reading and writing (literacy) instruction based on the individual group's needs.

Math

This week in math, we will begin Module 2: Place Value Concepts Through Metric Measurement. We will complete lessons 1-6, which focus on understanding place value through metric measurement. Students should complete the page numbers listed below for homework each night.

Science

This week, students will continue to study Weather and Climate and the 1900 Galveston hurricane as we attempt to answer the phenomenon questions, "What happens when the weather becomes severe?" and "How can people reduce the impact of weather hazards?". We will cover lessons 16-19. *Class assignments may be taken as a formative grade this week.* Students should review their logbook and their Learning Log nightly. There will be an end of the module test scheduled for **Wednesday, September 27th**.
