Math: This week the students will learn about the following topics:

Science: This week we will cover the following:

- Begin learning about the process of erosion and how it causes changes in landscapes at varying rates (lessons 8-9).
- **Module 1, Lessons 8-11 Quiz** will be next Wednesday, September 13th.
- **Module 1, Lessons 1-11 Test** will be next Friday, September 15th.

ELA: As we continue with our Whipping Boy unit, we will utilize our novel and other mentor texts for the following:

- Explain how Prince Brat and Jemmy's relationship changes over time
- Compare and contrast characters using text evidence
- Locate and utilize text evidence to prepare for a Socratic seminar
- Participate in a Socratic seminar for a formative grade
