Welcome to my class! My name is Maxwell Suitt and I will be your child's AP Psychology teacher for the Fall Semester of 2023 at Destrehan High School. In selecting this class, you have taken an important step in ensuring that your child will develop those skills necessary to succeed in the not so distant college environment.

#### **Course Information**

The AP Psychology course introduces students to the systematic and scientific study of human behavior and mental processes. While considering the psychologists and studies that have shaped the field, students explore and apply psychological theories, key concepts, and phenomena associated with such topics as the biological bases of behavior, sensation and perception, learning and cognition, motivation, developmental psychology, testing and individual differences, treatments of psychological disorders, and social psychology. Throughout the course, students employ psychological research methods, including ethical considerations, as they use the scientific method, evaluate claims and evidence, and effectively communicate ideas. The AP Psychology course is designed to be the equivalent of the Introduction to Psychology course usually taken during the first college year.

#### **Grading:**

Powerschool is an important tool in following your child's progress throughout the semester. If you do not have a login for this app, please contact the Destrehan High School Office immediately. DHS follows a 60% summative with 40% formative grading policy. This means summative grades (tests, projects, presentations, etc.) count for 60% of a student's overall average while daily formative grades (class work, homework, quizzes etc.) count for 40% of a student's overall average. The students overall semester grade will be an average of all four quarters. Honors points are added (7 points for an "A", 5 points for a "B", and 3 points for a "C") before quarter grades are submitted to match the rigor of an Advanced Placement course.

#### **Homework:**

AP Psychology is challenging and stimulating and, compared with other high school courses, takes more time and requires more homework. Homework is due at the beginning of class or when noted on Google Classroom. I cannot overemphasize the importance of putting effort into your homework. AP Psychology requires work at home to cover all of the topics necessary to perform well on summative tests throughout the semester as well as the AP Exam in May. Lack of effort on homework WILL have a negative effect on your grade in this class!

#### **Assignments:**

In the course of the semester, the biggest assignments students will work on include, but are not limited to:

- → In-class Presentations
- → Anatomical Models
- → Scientific Journal Analysis
- → In-class Laboratory Exercises
- → Unit Tests and Quizzes

This class is very discussion based. I understand that talking in class is not everyone's strongest point. My goal is for students to gain confidence and skills that they can take with them outside of the class.

#### **Late Work:**

Due to the large workload and the constant threat of falling behind, my policies concerning late work and absences are as follows. Students must turn in all work on time to receive full credit. I will deduct 13% of the original grade students would have received for each of the three days after the original due date (max of 39% deduction). After that time, students will receive a zero for that assignment. Exams missed due to absence(s), will be taken within THREE school days after their return unless prior arrangements are made. Students are strongly encouraged to let me know if they are going to miss class beforehand, if it is indeed possible to know, so that we can make a plan together for when work can be made up. Each student, not the teacher, is responsible for his/her make-up work.

#### AP Exam:

The Advanced Placement Psychology Exam is the culminating activity of this course. Students are required to take the AP exams for all AP courses in which they are enrolled during the 2023-2024 school year. AP exams are beneficial because they serve as a valuable feedback tool to the student on a national scale. In addition, they help prepare students for future comprehensive exams at the college level. AP exams enable students to potentially receive university credit or advanced placement at most universities. St. Charles Parish Public Schools will pay the fees for the required AP exams. AP Psychology will be taking their exam on Thursday May 9, 2024 from 12:00PM to 3:00PM here at Destrehan High School.

#### **Final Advice:**

This course is challenging, but students can succeed in this class if they follow these key steps:

- Keep up with assignments; it will be less stressful in the long run.
- Ask for help when they need it. I am here to help your child succeed!
- Work hard every day...all have the potential to excel

Your child will be receiving a copy of the course syllabus, which I will review in grave detail on the first day of class. I ask that you also go over the material with your child at home so that we all know what can be expected and we can successfully begin the process of working together. As you can see AP Psychology may be hard work but by working together, we can make this year a great one, one that may be memorable for all the right reasons.
