Allemands Elementary School is committed to building the foundation of life-long learning for all students in a safe, respectful environment.


## **PRE-K NEWS**

## Easing Back Into School

Welcome back! At the Family Center, families are invited to join other parents and children for activities, information and resources. All programs and activities are free. Highlights of the family center include weekly playgroups, educational resources, workshops, volunteer days, and much more. We hope you are able to join us throughout the year or that we can be of service to you and your family.

Back to School is an exciting time for students and parents. A few tips might help you and your child get off on the right foot.

Take advantage of opportunities to get to know your child's teacher. Attend the orientation meeting and Open House. Use those times to meet your child's classmates and families. It might also be helpful to set up a play date with a child or two from your child's new class.

#### Clear the decks

Clear away a special area in your house for your child's book bag, lunchbox, and jacket. Establish a routine that puts your child in charge of clearing out and hanging up the backpack each day. This will make the morning rush a little less hectic.

#### Read all about it

Be sure to review the papers from your child's backpack each day. Lots of schools use student backpacks and "take home folders" as ways of communicating with families. This is especially true during the first few weeks of school when lots of forms come home.

Now that your child is in school, she may feel too old for some of her childhood favorites, but find some quiet time at the end of each day to share a book or two. Take a few minutes to talk about her feelings and her day at school.

## Social Studies Corner

## First Quarter Report Card Grade Level Expectations

## Kindergarten

- Rules at home and school.
- Responsibilities of being a good citizen at home and school.
- People in the community and their roles.

## First Grade

- Describe a list of rules for the classroom and describe their benefits and consequences.
- Examples of rules and laws in the home, school and community.
- Identify jobs within the school and community.
- Compare traditions/celebrations, customs, languages, and food within the community.
- Describe the students role, rights and responsibility as a citizen of the class, the school, and the community.
- Identify the current president, governor, and parish president.

## Second Grade

- Interpret maps using title, key, symbols, compass rose.
- Construct maps
- Identify major geographical features in the local region, state, and country.
- Locate and identify the poles, 1 equator, continents, oceans, the United States, Louisiana, and local community.
- Describe changes in the characteristics of the local community over time.
- Describe how locations, weather and physical features affect where people live and work.
- Compare present day community to the past using primary resources.
- Compare basic land use and economic activities in the urban, suburban and rural environments.
- Identify natural disasters, predict where they may occur, and explain their effect on the people and environment.
- Identify natural resources and cite ways people conserve, protect, and replenish them.


