

## pre-k

- Pre-K has been learning how people in our community help keep us healthy and safe. We enjoyed visits from the St. Charles Parish Sheriff Departments and from Lillie Bourgeois of the LSU School of Dentistry.
- We are continuing to work on developing all the essential skills needed before Kindergarten like letter identification, sounds, numbers, counting, and much more.










## kindergarten





- During our Skills Strand, we work on reading simple three-sound words. We say each sound in the word and blend the sounds together to say the word.
- We are working on segmenting sounds in words in order to hear each sound in a given word. This will help us in spelling words.
- In our Knowledge Strand, we enjoyed hearing stories and fables. We discussed characters, setting, and plot.



- We have learned about flat and solid shapes. Next, we will learn about measurement!
- Students are enjoying the use of chromebooks. They listen to holiday read alouds, practice reading skills on Amplify, and practice math skills on Zearn.







Welcome back first grade families In the month of January our first graders are continuing to build their knowledge in all subjects. In Skills, we are learning to read and write words with vowel digraphs. We started a new reader, Fables. Have your child discuss the story read in class with you. You can help by asking about the characters, setting, and major events in the story. In Knowledge, we have enjoyed learning about Early Word Civilizations. We will move into learning about Early American Civilizations. To learn more check out a book at your local library and add it to your reading log. Your student is learning more about solving addition and subtraction problems within 20, understanding place value within teen numbers, and solving words problems. Please continue to complete the nightly homework to support your child with the skills we are learning. We look forward to a wonderful second half of our school year. Please continue to remind your child of the importance in showing CARES throughout our learning day!

second grade

Happy New Year! Second graders will be revisiting their Hopes and Goals to reflect and prepare for new learning. Our CKLA Knowledge Domains are Cycles in Nature and Westward Expansion. Students learned about Earth's movement and planned an experiment to explore the life cycle of a flowering plant. When reading, students should use a variety of reading strategies and should be able to ask and answer questions about a text. Second graders continue to write in response to questions. In math, students will continue solving word problems and using place value strategies to add and subtract within 1,000. Please have your child practice math facts to 20. Your continued home

support is appreciated.

### A Note from the Family Center



#### How Can You Support Your Child Academically:

Find out how your child is doing.

Ask the teacher how well your child is doing in class compared to other students. If your child is not keeping up, especially when it comes to reading, ask what you or the school can do to help. It's important to act early before your child gets too far behind. Also be sure to review your child's report card each time it comes out.

Make sure that your child gets homework done.

Let your child know that you think education is important and that homework needs to be done each day. You can help your child with homework by setting aside a special place to study, establishing a regular time for homework, and removing distractions such as the television and social phone calls during homework time. If you are reluctant to help your child with homework because you feel that you don't know the subject well enough or because you don't speak or read English, you can help by showing that you are interested, helping your child get organized, providing the necessary materials, asking your child about daily assignments, monitoring work to make sure that it is completed, and praising all of your child's efforts. Remember that doing your child's homework for him won't help him in the long run.

• Find homework help for your child if needed. If it is difficult for you to help your child with homework or school projects, see if you can find someone else who can help. Contact the school, tutoring groups, after school programs, churches, and libraries. Or see if an older student, neighbor, or friend can help.

Help your child prepare for tests.

Tests play an important role in determining a student's grade. Your child may also take one or more standardized tests during the school year, and your child's teacher may spend class time on test preparation throughout the year. As a parent, there are a number of ways that you can support your child before and after taking a standardized test, as well as a number of ways you can support your child's learning habits on a daily basis that will help her be more prepared when it's time to be tested.

#### Apoye los esfuerzos académicos de su hijo

- Averigüe cómo le está yendo a su hijo en sus cursos. Pregúntele a la maestra cómo le está yendo a su
  hijo en comparación con los demás estudiantes. Si su hijo se está rezagando, especialmente en la lectura,
  consulte qué puede hacer usted o la escuela para ayudar. Es importante actuar oportunamente antes de
  que su hijo se retrase demasiado. Lea los reportes o informes escolares de su rendimiento académico.
  Para obtener más información, consulte la página Cómo saber si su hijo necesita ayuda adicional.
- Supervise la tarea. Haga a su niño comprender que usted piensa que la educación es algo importante y que hay que cumplir con la tarea escolar. Usted le puede ayudar a su niño con la tarea en las maneras siguientes: aparte un lugar especial para que su niño estudie, fije una hora para hacer la tarea, y elimine las distracciones cómo el televisor y llamadas sociales. También hay muchas maneras en que usted puede ayudar si no conoce la materia a fondo o porque no domina el inglés tan bien como su hijo.
- Busque quién le ayude a su hijo con las tareas. Si se le dificulta ayudarle a su hijo con las tareas o los proyectos escolares, consulte para encontrar a alguien más que pueda ayudarle. Comuníquese con la escuela, los grupos de tutoría, los programas después de la escuela, las iglesias y las bibliotecas o busque la ayuda de un estudiante mayor, vecino o amigo.
- Ayude a su hijo preparar para las pruebas. Las pruebas estandarizadas cumplen en la actualidad un papel fundamental en las escuelas públicas de los Estados Unidos. Su hijo puede dar una o más pruebas estandarizadas durante el año escolar y es posible que el maestro de su hijo dedique tiempo de clase a la preparación para el examen a lo largo del año. Como padre o madre, hay muchas formas de apoyar a su hijo antes y después de dar una prueba estandarizada, así como también hay muchas formas de apoyar los hábitos de estudio de su hijo a diario, que lo ayudará a estar mejor preparado cuando llegue el momento de la prueba.

Children should be active for 60 minutes or more a day.


Limit daily screen time to avoid children being too sedentary.




