In order to prepare you for the study of literature in my gifted Advanced Placement Literature and Composition class, you are required to complete a summer reading assignment. In an effort to make summer reading more enjoyable, I am limiting the reading to just one book, *The Joy Luck Club* by Amy Tan. However, in order to receive credit for the summer reading, on the first day of class you must bring me your annotated copy of the book; annotations may be done either with sticky notes or direct writing in the book. In addition, on the first day in class, you will have forty minutes to write an analysis essay on the same book. This essay will prepare you for future Advanced Placement tests. I took into consideration the need for students to have a break and tried to respect that need while still providing a meaningful way for students to continue to practice their reading and analysis skills.

In addition to this book, you may obtain the following books, which we will read throughout the semester:

- Invisible Man by Ralph Ellison
- Mrs. Dalloway by Virginia Woolf
- Brave New World by Aldous Huxley
- *Persuasion* by Jane Austen
- Candide by Voltaire (translation does not matter)

For supplies, you will need:

- A three-ring binder
- o Highlighters
- o Pencils/Pens (I do not care as to color of ink)
- o Sticky notes (if this is your preferred way to annotate your books)
