Greetings from Mr. Madere:

As we approach the end of the fall semester, I want to remind all parents to stay involved in your child's academics and activities. I encourage you to ask questions about homework, what they are learning, your child's next test date, and insist that they take the time to prepare for classes. You can help your child by checking the Parent Portal; e-mailing teachers for information about his/her progress, checking our school and teacher websites for events and resources, and by talking to your child about his/ her classes. Don't forget to utilize e-mail, teacher websites, or call the school, in order to address any concerns you have about your child.

Our faculty has developed goals and action steps to improve student learning. One of the action steps that you can help us directly with is in regards to student attendance and tardiness to school. Unless your child is ill or has a doctor's appointment, I urge you to get him/ her to school every day and to insist that they be on time. This is especially important with the new State Attendance guidelines. We are still having issues at the beginning of the day with students being tardy in the morning. Our doors open for student entry at 6:58 and students are tardy if they are not in their desks in Homeroom by

7:15. Many students are riding to school in cars and some without parking permits are parking in the nearby streets and walking to school. If this situation pertains to your child, please speak to your child about this practice and encourage them to leave early enough to avoid delays by traffic or trains.

Counselor News:



Senior parents should be encouraging their seniors to narrow down the choice of schools to which they plan to apply. The senior counselors encourage seniors to get their applications for admissions in before Christmas.

This year, students can complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) starting October 1st. Be aware that students must be accepted by a college before they will be considered for financial aid. Students must show proof that they completed the FAFSA by an email that says your FAFSA has been successfully processed in order to receive a jeans day

pass. The proof needs to be turned in to your counselor by October 31st!!

Seniors and their parents are invited to attend the St. Charles Parish's College and Career Night for high school students on Thursday anytime between 6:00-7:30 p.m. This year the event will be held at the Edward Dufresne Center in Luling. The program will help students begin to make decisions about their future educational plans and/or careers. Students will be able to gather information and speak to representatives from Louisiana's 4-year colleges, 2year colleges, vocationaltechnical colleges, trade schools, apprenticeship programs, and the military. Representatives from the Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance will be available to provide financial aid information, including the TOPS scholarship.

TLC

The Learning Center is a great opportunity for free academic support. We offer afterschool tutoring to all grade levels and multiple courses. Students can attend TLC to make up assessments, study for upcoming assessments, or simply work on homework assignments. If your student is unsure of how to sign-up, they can ask any teacher, counselor, or administrator. TLC is an extension of the school day. If a student does not abide by the TLC rules, they will lose the privilege to attend TLC.

TLC Rules

- Students must have an ID to enter.
- Uniforms must be worn.
- Food is not allowed.
- Phones will be collected in the testing room.
- Students must have academic work to do.

- Students will be dismissed at 4:20 to the bus.
- If students need to leave early, they must be checked out through the front office.

Seniors and juniors who have permits to park on campus may leave early.






Signs and Symptoms of Vaping Addiction

Nicotine is a highly addictive chemical that is found in the tobacco plant. Tobacco products—including cigarettes, cigars, smokeless tobacco, hookah, and most vapes—contain nicotine.

Vaping Can Be Very Addictive

Nicotine can change the way your brain works, causing cravings for more of it. If you vape you might end up addicted to nicotine faster than if you smoked.1,2 Nicotine from vapes reaches your brain within 10 seconds.3,4

Teen Brain Development

If you think that getting addicted could never happen to you, think again. You're actually more vulnerable than adults to addiction because your adolescent brain is still developing. Nicotine exposure during adolescence can disrupt normal brain development and may have long-lasting effects, such as increased impulsivity and mood disorders. Nicotine can also cause long-term changes to your brain, affecting memory and the ability to focus and learn—which all promote addiction.67,8,9






Get to know...DHS Honor Societies
